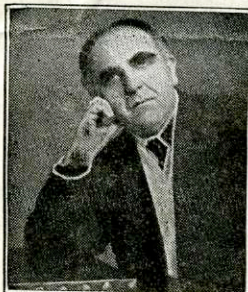

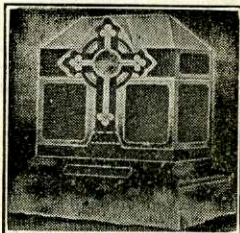

## THE FIRST BORN NEXT WEEK

### Real Chinamen to Be Actors in Next Week's Production With Baker Stock Company

The first stock production in this city of the famous Chinese drama, "The First Born," will be given by the Baker stock company all next week at this theatre. It will open Sunday matinee as usual, and in addition to all the regular members who are cast as Chinese characters, several genuie Chinamen have been secured which will add greatly to the novelty and interest. The scene is laid in old Chinatown, [San Francisco, one of the wonders of travelers on the American continent previous to the earthquake, and the plot deals with the never ceasing war that is being waged amongst the different Tong and Highbinder Societies. This one act play entitled "Sheridan's Ride," and it is nothing but action and excitement from the moment the curtain rises to the great climax which introduces a battle scene with horse, cannon and company of militiamen in the thick of the fight. Next week will certainly be novel and sensational enough to wake up the senses of the most blase theatre goer, and will doubtless play to crowded houses all the time.
