Peter Breughel, a Dutch painter, living from 1525 till 1569, was famous for his paintings of the gay and rough life of the peasants in the country. Three girls are sitting of an evening in the square of their village, very much bored with themselves. A stranger and his bride come dancing into the square and immediately the young fellow flirts with all three girls. As soon as he has rid himself of his bride, he dances with each of the three girls until his bride reappears. She quarrels with her three competitors while the young fellow disappears. When he returns he is clad in the garb of a monk and all four maidens go down on their knees to him. He finally reveals himself to the girls and the five young people dance a dance of gaiety.
