Alfredo's ardor overcomes Violetta's hesitation. But her happiness is short-lived. Alfredo's father, discovering the affair, pleads with Violetta to set free his son. Violetta, knowing that it will be impossible to send Alfredo away by any ordinary means, leaves him to infer that she has been faithless to him, and returns again to Paris. Alfredo is confronted by his father, who reminds the heartbroken lover of all that waits at home—forgiveness, the love of parents and sister, and the fair land of Provence, where the past may be forgotten and healed. "Di Provenza il mar" is the aria in which the father pours out his heart to his son.
