

The Exposition will commemorate the one hundredth anniversary of the exploration of the Oregon Country by an expedition planned by President Jefferson and commanded by Captains Meriwether Lewis and William Clark. Old Oregon comprised the present states of Oregon, Washington and Idaho, and parts of Montana and Wyoming. Its area was 307,000 square miles Its population in 1850 was 13.294; in 1904 it is 1,500,000.



THE EXPOSITION

g in a nutshell g

Ten large exhibit palaces form the nucleus of the Exposition. Around these cluster the State, Territorial and Concessions buildings, special pavilions, the Administration group, the Auditorium, and numerous smaller pseudo-exhibit structures. main exhibit palaces are: (1) Agriculture: (2) Liberal and Industrial Arts: (3) Foreign Exhibits: (4) Forestry; (5) Horticulture; (6) Mines and Metallurgy: (7) United States Government Exhibit Building; (8) Oceanic Building; (9) United States Fisheries, Forestry and Irrigation Building: (10) Machinery. Electricity and Transportation. Forestry Building, constructed entirely of huge logs felled in the Oregon forests, will be the most striking architectural creation ever seen at an exposition. The United States Government Building will occupy the Peninsula in the center of Guild's Lake. It will cover three acres, will cost \$250,000, and will have two towers, each of which will be 260 feet high.

Life, color, demonstration and motion will be the chief features of all departments of the Exposition.

Portland, the Exposition City, has 130,000 inhabitants. Within a radius of 300 miles of Portland there are 1,200,000 people, and within 500 miles there are 1,900,000.
