

LEWIS AND CLARK BILLS IN CONGRESS OF UNITED STATES

S. 276- Introduced in Senate by Senator Mitchell,
November 11, 1903. C. R. 37-179

H. R. 2870- Introduced in House by Representative
Williamson, November 16, 1903. C. R. 37-277. Referred same day
to Select Committee on Industrial Arts and Expositions. Not
afterward considered. History of S 276 follows:

December 10, 1903- Senator Mitchell gives notice that he
will address the Senate on the Bill on December 17, 1903. C. R.
38-93

December 17, 1903- Senator Mitchell delivers speech.
C. R. 38-325 to 338

December 17, 1903- Senator Fulton gives notice that he
will speak on the bill. C. R., 38-338

December 18, 1903- Senator Fulton's speech. C. R., 38-369
to 371

December 18, 1903. Bill referred to Senate Committee on
Industrial Arts and Expositions. C. R., 38-371

January 8, 1904- Senator Mitchell submits joint memorial
of Oregon Legislature. C. R., 38-551

January 8, 1904- Representative Hermann same as above.
C. R., 38-589

January 13, 1904- Senate Committee on Industrial Arts
and Expositions reports bill favorably with amendments. C. R.,
38-699

January 13, 1904- Representative Williamson submits
Memorial of Oregon Legislature. C. R., 38-739

January 18, 1904- Senator Platt submits Senator Hawley's
amendment for Sunday closing. C. R., 38-819

February 1, 1904- Senator Mitchell submits amendment
reducing the appropriation from \$2,125,000 to \$1,775,000. C. R.,
38-1445

February 8, 1904- Bill debated and passed in Senate.
C. R., 38-1719 to 1727

February 9, 1904- Bill reported to House and referred to
Committee on Industrial Arts and Expositions. C. R., 38-1783

March 28, 1904- Tawney reports bill as amended with report
(No. 1965). Referred to Committee of Whole on State of Union. C. R.,
38-3908

March 29, 1905- Tawney reports resolution making bill
privileged. Objected to and lost. C. R., 38-3964

March 30, 1904- Tawney renews request of previous day.
Objection again and lost again. C. R., 38-4019

April 4, 1904- Debated in House. Rules not suspended
and Bill fails to pass. C. R., 38-4245 to 4251

April 4, 1904- Tawney again offers his resolution of March 29th. House again refuses to suspend rules and Bill lost. C. R., 38-4252

April 5, 1904- Tawney's resolution referred to the Committee on Rules. C. R., 38-4343

April 8, 1904- Dalzell reports resolution from Committee on Rules. Bill debated and passed. C. R., 38-4501 to 4504

April 9, 1904- Senate concurs in House amendments. C. R., 38-4572

April 12, 1904- Bill signed by President Pro-tem of the Senate. C. R., 38-4670

April 12, 1904- Bill signed by Speaker Cannon. C. R., 38-4721

April 13, 1904- Bill signed by President Roosevelt. C. R., 38-4801
