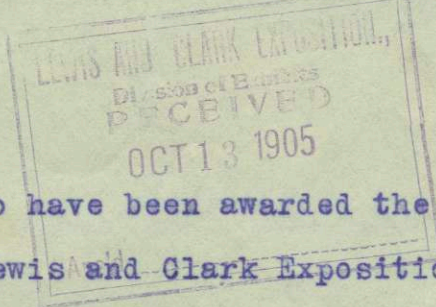


LEWIS AND CLARK EXPOSITION.
